"Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy."

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied."

"Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God."

"Blessed are those persecuted for righteousness sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the children of God."
