Key Vocabulary

Spelling	Definition/Sentence
Resurrection	The action or fact of resurrecting or being resurrected. In Christian belief, the rising of Christ from the dead.
Pentecost	The Christian festival celebrating the descent of the Holy Spirit on the disciples of Jesus after his Ascension, held on the seventh Sunday after Easter.
Disciple	A personal follower of Christ during his life, especially one of the twelve Apostles.
Pharisee	A teacher of scriptures and a member of an ancient Jewish sect, distinguished by strict observance of the traditional and written law.
Tax Collector	A tax collector is a person who collects unpaid taxes from other people.
Gospel	The teachings of Jesus Christ also to preach/ spread the gospel. There are four Gospels in the New Testament: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.
Baptism	The Christian religious rite of sprinkling water on to a person's forehead or of immersing them in water, symbolising purification or regeneration and admission to the Christian Church. In many denominations, baptism is performed on young children and is accompanied by name giving.
Rosary	In the Roman Catholic Church, a form of devotion in which five (or fifteen) decades of Hail Marys are repeated, each decade preceded by an Our Father and followed by a Glory Be.
